## **COURSE DESCRIPTION**

Students will be introduced to the history of the United States from Colonial times through Reconstruction. The course is divided chronologically into eras. Students learn to place major events on a timeline and to analyze the causes and effects of historical events. Using primary and secondary sources, they explore time and place in nineteenth century America. They will compare conflicting accounts of the past and express informed judgments about significant events that shaped the nation. Students will deepen their understanding of major geographical themes and basic economic concepts while building an understanding of American government.

A variety of instructional strategies and methodologies will be used to create a dynamic learning environment. Visual Thinking Routines, 21<sup>st</sup> Century Learning, and Whole Brain Teaching are classroom concepts that will be used to enhance the curriculum.

## GRADING

Grading is based on class participation, assignments, assessment, and projects. Final grades will be calculated by totaling the number of points received and dividing by the amount of points possible.

Grades will be updated and available on myRCS.

**DNC** - If an assignment (homework) is not completed it will be entered into the gradebook as a **DNC** (*Did Not Complete*). This will calculate within the gradebook as a 50%, which is still a grade letter E. However, it will not unfairly penalize a student as how a 0% would.

**NHI** - Projects and some special assignments will receive a **NHI** (*Not Handed In*) until this assignment is handed in. This will calculate as a 0% until the student turns in that project or special assignment.
