Amending the Constitution

METHOD 1

- Congress proposes an amendment
 - 2/3 of HofR (287 of the 435) approves
 - 2/3 of Senate (66 of the 100) approves
- If approved it is sent to the states' legislatures.
 - 3/4 (38) states must approve

Amending the Constitution

METHOD 2

- A Constitutional Convention to be called for by 2/3 (33) of the state legislatures.
- One or more amendments can be proposed.
- Sent to the state legislatures (or state conventions)
 for approval again
 - 3/4 of the state legislatures must approve.

- Passed in 1795
- You cannot bring a state or the federal government to trial for criminal crimes.

- **1803**
- President is elected by Electoral College
- and the Vice President by the Electoral College NOT 2nd place

- Emancipation Proclamation 18
- Passed in 1865

Analia bankery 5

- **1870**
- Right to vote could not be denied based on race, color, or that you were previously



- **1913**
- Changed process of selecting Senators.
 People would now elect them.

- 1992 / Took 203 years to be approved.
- Prevents members of Congress from giving themselves pay raises during the current session.

- **1919**
- Prohibition of liquor

- 1933 (14 years later)
- Repealed Amendment 18

- Proposed 1920
- Gave women the right to vote

- **1951**
- Limited the Presidency to two terms
