Amending the Constitution

METHOD 1

- Congress proposes an amendment
- 2/3 of each house (287 of the 435- member House of Representatives, and 66 of the 100 Senators) to pass a proposed amendment.
- If approved it is sent to the states' legislatures. It takes 3/4 (38) states' approval of the amendment in order for it to be added to the Constitution.

Amending the Constitution

METHOD 2

- A Constitutional Convention to be called for by 2/3
 (33) of the state legislatures. At such a convention,
 one or more amendments can be proposed.
- Sent to the state legislatures (or state conventions) for approval again, 3/4 of the state legislatures must approve. (*This method has not been used successfully*).

Amendment 11

- Passed in 1795
- You cannot bring a state or the federal government to trial for criminal crimes.

Amendment 12

Discusses how the president is elected and extends the criteria to the office of the vicepresident.
