- 1 - freedom of speech, freedom of religion, and freedom of the press
- 2 - right to bear arms
- 3 - prohibits punishment of soldiers
- 4 - prohibits unreasonable searches & seizures
- 5 - protects right of due process
- 6 - protects many rights in a criminal case
- 7 - rights to trial by jury
- 8 - prohibits excessive fines and cruel and unusual punishments
- 9 - protects rights not listed in the constitution
- 10 - no right reserved to the federal government belongs to the state
