 - Transportation (Mississippi River/Erie Canal)
 - Communication
- National Road (Cumberland)

 - People were prosperous (doing well) and happy

- John Quincy Adams Secretary of State
- Unopposed for second term (No one ran against him)
- Last of the Revolutionary War Presidents

CRISIS

- Many Americans couldn't pay back loans
 - Banks failed
 - Lost belongings & homes

BORDER ISSUES

- Spanish Florida
 - Spain did little to govern territory
 - Indian raids Attacking U.S. settlements in Georgia
 - Monroe sends troops in under Andrew Jackson
 - Jackson takes control of Florida
- <u>After</u>, we purchase Florida from Spain (give away)


CRISIS

- Slavery
 - Missouri Territory wanted to become states
 - Would it be slave or free
 - Monroe owned slaves & supported states deciding to be slave or free state


MISSOURI COMPROMISE

"Devised" by Henry Clay

How should new states to be added (free or slave state)



- States north 36"30' Latitude would be free /south would be slave states
- Missouri would decide if they were slave or free (SLAVE)
- 3. Added Maine (FREE) to balance number of free & slave states (11-11)



The Monroe Doctrine



Monroe Doctrine

- Many border disputes during his time
 - Spain Florida & Mexico breaks away
 - Russia Alaska
 - Central & South America Revolutions
- John Quincy Adams drew up the plan
- James Monroe included it in his 2nd inaugural address
- Warned other countries to leave <u>Americas</u> alone.
 - Do NOT get involved in our politics
 - Do NOT colonize our lands
 - Stay out of our hemisphere (Western)
