Abolitionist Newspaper by Frederick Douglas

A failed attempt to arm a slave rebellion using the weapons at the federal arsenal

The Underground Railroad

Awareness of the needs of the Mentally Ill

There was a push to prevent the mentally ill from being imprisoned with criminals

Famous Speech by Sojourner Truth a famous Abolitionist and Suffragette

John Brown's Raid on Harper's Ferry

Common School Movement

19th Amendment

Nat Turner's Slave Rebellion

Promoted the idea that all children should be taught in a common place regardless of background

The Liberator

Abolitionist Newspaper by William Lloyd Garrison

Gave women the right to vote in 1920

School Reform

Saw the establishment of special schools for the deaf and blind

Lowell Female Labor Reform Association

The group that promoted the banning of hard liquor and fought for prohibition

First women's rights convention held by the Suffragist Movement
