  - Norfolk, Charles Town, and Savannah labeled

  - Appalachian Mt. from Pennsylvania to Georgia, p. 82
  - clearly colored

<p><u>Characteristics of New England</u></p> <p>Physical Geography</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Jagged coastline – Excellent harbors</li> <li>• Some of world’s richest fishing and whaling grounds</li> <li>• Forests</li> <li>• Soil – thin and rocky</li> <li>• Short Growing Season - Long winter</li> </ul> <p>Farming</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Subsistence farming</li> </ul> <p>Where people live</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Towns</li> </ul> <p>Economic Activity - Tied to sea</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Fishing and Whaling</li> <li>• Lumbering</li> <li>• Shipbuilding</li> <li>• Merchants – involved in shipping and trade</li> </ul> <p>People</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Largest Group – English settlers</li> </ul>	<p><u>Characteristics of the Middle Colonies</u></p> <p>Physical Geography</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Longer growing season</li> <li>• Fertile soil – suited to grain</li> </ul> <p>Economic Activity – Cash crop farming –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Especially grain, called “breadbasket”</li> </ul> <p>Where People Live</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Cities – Philadelphia, New York</li> <li>• Large farms with villages</li> </ul> <p>People – great diversity – made people tolerant</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• English - largest group</li> <li>• Germans – next largest</li> <li>• Also Dutch, Scots-Irish, Irish, Scottish, Welsh, Swiss, and French</li> </ul>
<p><u>Characteristics of the Southern Colonies</u></p> <p>Physical Geography</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Warm and humid</li> <li>• Almost year-round growing season</li> <li>• Tidewater - area along coast ,a flat lowland with swampy areas</li> <li>• Piedmont - area of rolling hills in west</li> </ul> <p>Economic Activity –</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Tidewater is plantation land – grow rice and sugar cane <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Caribbean planters come and bring slaves</li> <li>○ Crops required much labor in order to make a profit – Need slave labor</li> </ul> </li> <li>• Piedmont - area of rolling hills in west <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Small tobacco and subsistence farms</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>Where People Live -</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Plantations &amp; subsistence farms largely self-sufficient -</li> <li>• Big cities rare</li> </ul> <p>People</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Planter Class - Small part of population controls political and economic power</li> <li>• Africans are enslaved - 40% of South’s population</li> <li>• Small farmers can’t compete and move west</li> </ul>	<p><u>Characteristics of the Backcountry</u></p> <p>Physical geography - In or near Appalachians Mountains</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Rushing streams</li> <li>• Dense forests</li> </ul> <p>Where People Live - isolated homesteads</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• travel difficult - rivers unnavigable due to waterfalls starting in piedmont, few roads</li> </ul> <p>Farming</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Subsistence farming – not even tobacco <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ hunting and gathering needed to add food</li> </ul> </li> </ul> <p>Economic Activity</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Trade with Native Americans</li> </ul> <p>People - Scots-Irish</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• driven to come to the colonies due to poverty and famine</li> <li>• bring Scottish clan system with them</li> </ul>
