COURSE DESCRIPTION

7th Grade Social Studies is a course designed to involve students in the study of the Eastern Hemisphere while exploring the Five Themes of Geography. Students will learn about the history, geography, culture, government, and economy of societies in Europe, Africa, Asia, and Australia. We will explore similarities and differences among the inhabitants in these regions.

A variety of instructional strategies and methodologies will be used to create a dynamic learning environment. Visual Thinking Routines, $21^{\rm st}$ Century Learning, and Whole Brain Teaching are classroom concepts that will be used to enhance the curriculum.

- Study of people, places, issues & current events of the Eastern Hemisphere

GRADING
