Course Description

Students will be introduced to the history of the United States from Colonial times through Reconstruction. The course is divided chronologically into eras. Students will learn to place major events on a timeline and to analyze the causes and effects of historical events. Using primary and secondary sources, they will explore time and place in nineteenth century America. They will compare accounts of the past and express informed judgments about significant events that shaped the nation. Students will deepen their understanding of major geographical themes and basic economic concepts while building an understanding of American government.
